Qi Gong Class

Qi Gong (pronounced chee gung), is an ancient practice, over 4000 years old. It is a gentle mind body and spirit practice, some call it a moving or standing meditation. It promotes vitality, wellness, prevention of disease and healthy energy, we could all be doing with more of that!

The soft rhythmic movements of Qi Gong reduce stress, build stamina, increase vitality and enhance the immune system. It has also been found to improve cardiovascular, respiratory, circulatory, lymphatic and digestive functions. The type pf Qi Gong I teach is Medical Qi Gong, based on the Chinese system of elements; metal, water, wood, fire, earth which correspond to the organ systems of the lungs, kidney, liver, heart and stomach / spleen.

Qi Gong reestablishes the mind / body / spirit connection. People who do Qi Gong to maintain health heal their bodies, calm their minds and reconnect with their spirit. The art of effortless power, originated by observing nature with human nature and how they coexist.

Qi Gong can be done by anyone which is what particularly appealed to me when I began my training. It mirrors the movement of nature and puts you in touch with the natural flow of energy in your body and mind. It is a great workout and a way to clear emotional stress and connect more deeply to the present moment, bringing you back into alignment, centred and grounded.

A typical class involves the following: Breath work, Activations, Stretches, Flow, Healing Sounds, Meditation, Short readings on nature (for example Tao Te Ching). Qigong can be done seated or standing or a mixture of the two. Qi Gong sessions can be in a group setting or one to one.
