#### Dear Friends,

Following on from the decision of the General Trustees to delay the congregational vote on the Draft Basis of Union between ourselves and Thornliebank, there have been a few meeting of Cluster Representatives. The last of these was a day conference where those present began to consider how the allocated ministry posts of 3 Full-Time equivalents and a 0.5 Ministries Development Staff Member could be shared amongst the 8 current congregations.

The Reps will be meeting again on Wednesday 13th March with our Presbytery's Congregational Facilitator to, hopefully, advance these conversations. There will then be an update made to the Annual Stated Meeting of our congregation, which will be held on **SUNDAY 17TH MARCH 2024**, immediately after worship.

flowers from the church who send their grateful thanks. Thanks should also go to Isabel Freer for taking the time to deliver the flowers.


# **Sunday School**




We have also been retelling the story of The Good Samaritan in different ways. Jamie and Hayley wrote their own version, while Seonaidh turned the story into a comic strip.

I am writing to acknowledge and thank you and the congregation at Eastwood Parish Church for the generous **WINTER donations** of £228.50 to assist us in our work with people who have lived experience of homelessness, vulnerability and social exclusion and are guests of our centre at the Lodging House Mission here in Glasgow.

Christmas can be a particularly difficult time for our client group and it is important for good mental wellbeing to have something positive to focus upon. Our **Christmas Day Program** which included; 3 course Christmas Day lunch, Quiz, and a present from Santa, was busier than ever before. We served over 100 meals and distributed 80+ presents to those who visited our event on Christmas Day.

In the current housing crisis, it is even more important to recognise the difference that individual contributions can make - helping to combat the sense of isolation that accompanies the experience of being without a forever home. This was overwhelmingly demonstrated in our 'Knit Together' Exhibition where individual contributions led to a display of over 140 colourful hand knitted blankets.
