Meet the Probationer

Hello to the whole Church Family at Eastwood Parish Church!

My name is William McCulloch and I have just begun my Probationary Period for Full Time Word and Sacrament (FTWS) Ministry. As of the 01 November 2024 I am under the supervision of your Minister, Jim, and I am looking forward to getting involved in the life of the congregation over the next 15 months. You may need to tell me your name a few times until I remember, please bear with me.

I am married to Hazle, and we have a son Euan who is 10 and we live in Neilston along with our two West Highland Terriers, Murdo and Barra. Neilston Parish is my home congregation where I was baptised and grew up through the Sunday School and the Church. I have been involved in many aspects of Church life and this included being the Beadle, an Elder and Property Convener.

The Church and my faith have always been a strong part of who I am and only on reflection do I realise that God had been calling me, I just wasn't open to this or wanted to think I could be a Minister. I did training through Presbytery to become a Local Worship Leader and this engulfed God's call for me.

Prior to training for Ministry, I began my working life as an apprentice joiner and once time served was a bench-hand joiner before I moved to a different aspect within my trade. I began lecturing in carpentry and joinery and construction in Reid Kerr College, now West College Scotland. I was lecturing for 17 years before I accepted God had other plans for me and resigned to take up training for FTWS Ministry.

The assessment and selection processes are very in-depth and encourages lots of reflection and prayer, as well as more forms than I thought possible, and I worked in education! My discernment placement was with Rev Yvonne Smith at Bishopton Parish Church and my first-year placement was with Rev Roy Henderson at Pollokshaws Parish Church. Sherbrooke Mosspark Parish Church with Rev Adam Dillon was my second-year placement and linked to this Adam

remained my supervisor and arranged for me to do part of my summer placement at the Preshal Trust in Govan. To complete the placements, I am required to do, I did the second part of my summer placement with Rev Jeanette Peel at Inverclyde Royal Hospital doing Hospital Chaplaincy. Last year I did 9 months Pulpit Supply at Kilmacolm: St Columba Parish Church, as well as doing Pulpit Supply in various other Churches for a week or two at a time. I have tried to ensure that I give myself as broad an experience as possible and try and learn from them all.

Woven in between the training was the academic studies at the University of Glasgow where I studied for a Bachelor of Divinity (BD), all the course work is completed and passed, and my formal graduation will be sometime in 2025.

As God has led me to Eastwood, I look forward to learning from you all and getting involved in the life of your Church Family.





Advent and Christmas Collections

The over-arching theme of our Christmas services this year is the word: "JOY". We are looking to help spread some joy this Advent and Christmas by raising funds to support two different charities: Launch Foods and The Lodging House Mission (LHM).

Launch Foods is a Glasgow based charity which was set up in 2018, in response to Glasgow's child poverty rates, with the sole purpose of tackling child food poverty in Glasgow. Over the last six years, they have provided in excess of **750,000** free meals and want to do more. They believe that no child in Scotland should be going hungry in 2024. The SWOP group suggests that all money raised from our Church Family BIG Christmas Card, from tea and coffee served after the services and from the Family Brunch on the 22nd December will be donated to Launch.

At our services on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day there will be retiring collections to support the work of the Lodging House Mission (LHM). LHM has been a source of support to homeless men and women in Glasgow for over a century

We are also mindful that it can be difficult to support every charity that needs help. All are equally deserving. No-one should feel obliged to donate but if you can, your donation can make a difference. A donation can also be made through the Church bank account.
